

LEATSS Online 2021 – Autumn Workshops

13 to 19 November

How LOW can you go?

It might be an autumn LOW (LEATSS Online Workshops) but could well serve as a high to fill the gap between summer holidays and Christmas flurries. To achieve this, LEATSS will be offering three short online courses on:

Shakespeare monologues (acting)

Solo singing (musical theatre)

Approaching new writing (acting).

The tutors are top-class professionals, all active in their respective fields and all experienced in teaching online so that courses are geared to the medium, enabling the work to be creative, spontaneous, inspiring and fun.

Because the emphasis is on process over product (how can we do it as opposed to how well can we perform), and because the atmosphere is supportive and friendly, participants from a wide range of skill and experience can be accommodated. The LOW courses are generally suitable for both adults and younger people.

The monologue and solo singing course will start and end with general sessions, but will be based around one-on-one tuition.

Applications:

These can be made <u>online</u> from 21st October. Applications will close on 10th November. Participants will receive an email confirmation together with details of payment. Waiting lists will be created should demand exceed capacity. If payment has not been received by 12th November, these places will be forfeited and given to the next person on the waiting list.

Should the minimum number of students for any one course not be attained, LEATSS reserves the right to cancel the course.

COURSE DETAILS

Tutor: Graeme Du Fresne, musical director, singing teacher, actor

Movie Musical (solo singing)

This course will look at songs from classic movie musicals. Participants are asked to choose one to work on as a solo. The course will start with a 1-hour group session followed by individual slots timetabled to suit each participant's availability, and end with a group session to share the work. A list of suggested songs can be found below but alternative suggestions can be made as long as they fall within the overall genre of Musical Theatre.

Tutor: Katy Stephens, actor, deviser, RSC Associate Artist

Shakespeare Monologues (acting)

This course will take participants through key strategies of how to tackle the verse and build a character. The first session will be a 2-hour introductory workshop followed by individual tutorials timetabled to suit each participant's availability. The course will end with a group session in which participants will be given the opportunity to share some of their work. Participants are invited to choose a text to work on, which need not be gender specific.

Tutor: Natasha Rickman, actor, director, playwright

Approaching New Writing (acting the unknown)

This course will explore how to approach new writing (plays written after 1970). We will cover how to break down a script, how to work with intentions and scene objectives and how to create 3-D characters. Each participant will work in pairs (or a group of three), trying out different approaches and skills step by step, before finally sharing the piece informally with the class.

All pieces are by female playwrights, chosen to allow deep insight into new works. Roles need not be gender specific – there will be great parts for everyone to get their teeth into.
